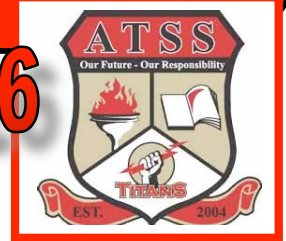

School Field Trip - May 26



We have planned a school field trip (grades 9 - 12) to bring parts of the curriculum at each grade level to life for the students.

Grade 9 students will travel to **Storyeum** in Vancouver

Grade 10 students will travel to the **Stave Falls Power House**

Grade 11 and 12 student have a choice - they may choose to go to:

UCFV or Storyeum or the Stave Lake Power House



Storyeum - Vancouver

(Social Studies, Health and Careers curriculum)

Our grade 9 students will leave the school early on May 26 to head out to Vancouver. After a picnic lunch in Strathcona Park, the students will attend the Storyeum exhibit in Gastown.

Storyeum is a 65-minute live theatrical adventure under the streets of historic Gastown. The show begins as students descend below the streets of Vancouver in one of the world's largest passenger lifts. The students will be engaged in a visually and orally entertaining lesson of 400 years of BC history. The guided tour will take students through a series of seven unique sets while stories from BC's past magically come to life around them. The final stage (there are 6 in total) is a 46-foot high, 360° visual experience of modern day, multicultural BC, which should be a grand closure!

Stave Falls Power House Tour (PE, Social Studies, Science curriculum)

The students will start our adventure with a 6km hike down a historic railway trail to Stave Lake. We will then tour a 1912 generating station to learn more about power production and transmission. The tour will also describe the development of the area and give the students an idea of what life was like at the turn of the century.



UCFV

(Science curriculum, Career and Personal Planning)

On Friday May 26 a group of aspiring scientists from ATSS will be heading to UCFV to participate in "Genomics on the Road".

This program is presented by Genome BC and allows students the opportunity to conduct forensic DNA analyses. As crime scene technicians, the students will use PCR and gel electrophoresis to analyze and compare the genotypes of suspect and crime scene DNA. These activities will also allow the students to explore the applications and impact of genetic technologies on Canadian Society.

The Chilliwack-Fraser Rotaract Club is a community service organization, affiliated with the Rotary Club. This organization donates time and money to projects local to the Fraser Valley, as well as to projects overseas.

The Grade 11 French class took a trip to Place des Arts Cultural Center, Maillardville in Coquitlam on their class recent field trip. They learned a little about the early 1900s, and the French people living in BC at that time. A brief tour of the center helped students learn more about the living style of the early 1900s and the sawmill "Fraser Mills", owned and operated, primarily, by French employees.



Students practiced their French while participating in two French workshops that had them improvising scenes from French fables and sketching an important mode of transport of the 1900's: the work horse. Dear Parents:

At its meeting May 1st, 2006 meeting, the Board of School Trustees passed a motion to adopt a local school calendar that will create a two-week Spring break by adding 9 minutes to secondary instructional school days, and 8 minutes to elementary and middle instructional school days. This will create four more instructional days than the previous modified calendar. This newly adopted calendar represents a compromise between the previous local calendar of the past four years which added 15 minutes a day to create a two-week Spring break and 4 other days off throughout the calendar year, and the standard school calendar which only has a one-week Spring break.

The Board of School Trustees is dedicated to maximizing student instructional contact time; therefore, under the newly adopted calendar, secondary schools will move to a five-block day which will increase the number of teacher contacts with students by 25%. In addition to increasing the number of instructional contacts, there will be fewer short weeks throughout the year. In 2006/07, all weeks will be five-day weeks, with the exception of those weeks with a statutory holiday or professional development day (13 weeks).

The Board of School Trustees takes its responsibility to provide our students with the best education possible very seriously. It is committed to working with teachers, administrators, support staff and parents to make our schools the best place for students to learn.

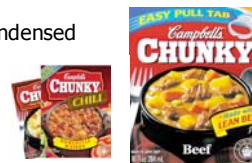

Mygradebook

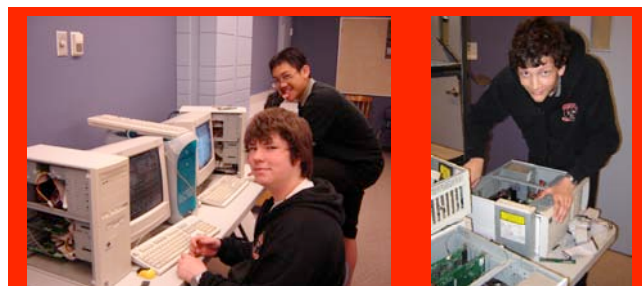
Individual teachers are in control of mygradebook passwords for students. Passwords do not randomly change. If they do change it is the teacher who changes them and then supplies the information to the students. If there is an issue with a student supplying a password to a parent the parent should call the school and leave a message for the teacher or ask the secretary for the teacher email address. The teacher can give the parent the password. There is an easy to set up system for multiple class logins so you only need one password. The instructions are at the login page of mygradebook.
